CLARIFICATIONS	AMENDMENTS/ ANSWERS
<p>The prospective bidder/s seeks clarification on the Omnibus Sworn Statement, pertaining to the submission of the Special Power of Attorney (SPA) would it be a separate submission of SPA from the joint venture partner since they are assigning their authorized representative also to do the bid</p>	<p>Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents particularly on I. (g) states that:</p> <p>Original duly signed Omnibus Sworn Statement (OSS) and if applicable, Original Notarized Secretary's Certificate in case of a corporation, partnership, or cooperative; or Original Special Power of Attorney of all members of the joint venture giving full power and authority to its officer to sign the OSS and do acts to represent the Bidder.</p>
<p>The prospective bidder/s raise a concern regarding on the Clause 5.2 of the Bid Data Sheet appear to impose additional conditions that go beyond the SLCC requirement outlined in the procurement rule.</p> <p>Clause 5.2 of the Bid Data Sheet states that:</p> <p>For this purpose, contracts similar to the Project refer to contracts which have the same major categories of work, which shall be Detailed Engineering Design and Construction of Land Development Works with Sewerage Treatment and Water Supply Facilities.</p> <p>Bidder or JV partner must have had a minimum of 10 years of experience in the field and has at least 50 completed Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP) projects regardless of capacity, location, and type of procuring entity that has passed the General Effluent Standards (GES) by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources' Administrative order 2016-08 and/or 2021-19.</p>	<p>This requirement aligns with the provisions of Republic Act No. 12009, also known as the New Government Procurement Act (NGPA). Specifically, this requirement incorporates the "Most Economically Advantageous Responsive Bid" (MEARB) criterion, as mandated by Section 42 of the aforementioned Act.</p> <p>Pursuant to the Government Procurement Policy Board (GPPB), the MEARB criterion may be employed when the procuring entity deems it necessary to consider both qualitative and economic values in project execution. The basic tenet of MEARB under the NGPA is the assignment of weights to both the technical and financial aspects of the project. These weights must be determined by the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC), upon the recommendation of the end-user unit.</p>
